Fee for Service Clinicians are responsible for:

- Providing counseling services one-on-one with youth who access our drop-in center
- Writing case notes and tracking participant utilization for grants, funders, and organizational reporting
- Supervision of social work or counseling interns, as needed
- Other duties as assigned

Qualifications:

- Master's Degree in Social Work, Counseling, or related field
- Licensed in Rhode Island as an LICSW, LMHC, or LMFT
- Experience working with a diverse population of youth
- Culturally-informed competency towards individuals identifying as LGBTQQ required
- Experience working with trans/gender non-conforming youth preferred
- Experience providing outpatient behavioral health treatment services required
- Successful candidate must pass a background check
- Bilingual in Spanish preferred
